InterMusic SF (then, San Francisco Friends of Chamber Music) is founded by Barbara Barclay, Jane Galante, and Jane Roos Le Roux with a commitment to nourish and sustain artistic careers of Bay Area musicians who focus on music for the small ensemble.



Under the leadership of Board of Director President Susan Bates, InterMusic SF raises its first cycle of local foundation funding and regrants awards to 23 Bay Area ensembles, establishing the Musical **Grant Program.**

The Cypress String Quartet is accepted as the inaugural affiliate of the Fiscal Sponsorship Program. One year later, Del Sol Quartet joined the roster as the program's third member.

The first annual SF Music Day (then, Chamber Music Day) is a vision and concept of then Executive Director **Dominique Pelletey. The event** features 15 ensembles and takes place at Congregation Emanu-El in San Francisco.



In partnership with Theatre Bay Area and Dancers' Group, InterMusic SF participates in administering the **Performing Arts Worker Relief Fund by** identifying artists financially impacted by the pandemic crisis. In 2020-21, the fund distributes over \$600,0000 to over 775 Bay Area arts workers.



San Francisco Friends of Chamber Music leadership takes a bold step forward and takes on a new name, InterMusic SF, reaffirming the organization's commitment to Bay Area musicians and audiences across genres and traditions.



The Musical Grant Program exceeds SIMM in distributed project grant awards, contributing to the production of over 400 concerts, operas, collaborative commissions, studio recordings, and more.

A chance meeting between them and Lorin over the summer, leading to some fruitful musical interactions, prompted THIS first official collaboration between these three musicians.



Sharmi Basu (they/them) is a multimedia performance artist, curator, composer, and arts organizer born and based in the unceded territories of the Chochenyo Ohlone peoples (Oakland, CA). They create expansive textural sound and performance pieces investigating resistance and organizing strategies through decolonial worldbuilding and interactive sculpture. Beast Nest transmutes experiences of trauma through complex sonic textural layering. Sharmi hosts workshops internationally that center on sound, somatics, decolonization, and conflict and accountability. They have performed at SFMOMA, YBCA, SFEMF, and Ableton Loop. They co-founded the first-ever Bay Area Black and Brown Punk Festival, and are known in their community for curating empowering creative spaces for disabled QTBIPOC artists.


